Tips For Helping Young Readers

What to do when young readers make a mistake:

1. If the mistake makes good sense, don't worry about it.
2. If the mistake doesn't make good sense, wait to see if the reader will fix it.
3. Say, "Try that again."
4. Say, "Did that make sense?"
5. Say, "Look at the picture," if there is one.
6. Say, "Did what you read look right and sound right?"
7. Say, "Read the sentence again from the beginning."
8. Tell the word.
